Emma Norton Services

Founded in 1917, Emma Norton Services is a nonprofit organization providing affordable housing and comprehensive services for homeless women and families in Minnesota.

Emma Norton Services

is a nonprofit organization serving women and families in the Twin Cities metropolitan area of Minnesota. The original residence, the Methodist Girls Club, opened in 1917 to provide housing for young women. When this facility closed in 1967, Emma Norton Residence was built and named after the woman whose gift helped make it possible, Mrs. Emma (Hayes) Norton. The residence provided safe and affordable housing for 72 young women who had come to the Twin Cities to work or attend school.

In 1968 the residence was modified and staff were trained to meet the needs of young students who were Deaf or Hard of Hearing. In 1973 the Wesley Family Program was started—providing housing for families with loved ones undergoing long-term recovery at nearby hospitals. Today, families from 28 countries and all 50 states have stayed at Emma Norton Residence.

Responding to the changing needs of women in a growing and increasingly diverse metropolitan area, Emma Norton Services began offering programs and services for women and families who were vulnerable or in transition in the early 1990s. Many of these women were homeless and dealing with the effects of domestic abuse, mental illness or chemical dependency.

Today, the 42-bed Emma Norton Residence, located in downtown St. Paul, offers on-site support and services for homeless women in transition through the Jane Addams Transitional Housing Program and the Dual Disorder Program. Emma's Place, which is located in Maplewood, provides permanent housing targeted to homeless, single-parent families with four or more children.

Letter from the Board President and Executive Director



Dear Friends and Supporters,

As Nelda and I reflect back on 2003, I think what we are most proud of is how when times got really tough, everyone—our staff, board, volunteers and donors—all pulled together to get us through. As many of you know, Emma Norton Services faced some significant financial challenges during 2003. Because of major cuts in state and federal funds, as well as funding cuts from some local foundations we had relied on in past years, we had to do some serious belt-tightening.

Meeting changing needs . . . In June, we discontinued our Wesley Family Program, which offered rooms at a nominal fee to people with relatives in local hospitals. It wasn't used much and we decided we could better use those rooms for other needs. We also suspended the Scattered Site Family Reunification Program at the end of August. We hope to reinstate this program, which helps reunite parents with their children, once funding becomes available. Although these were difficult decisions to make, once we made them we never looked back. We have, instead, focused our energies on learning how to meet the ongoing challenge of funding our other very important and valuable community programs and services.

One of those is Emma's Place, which celebrated its first anniversary in July 2003 and as you receive this report, has celebrated its second anniversary! This continues to be a model permanent supportive housing program targeted to large, single-parent families. Be sure to check out Teresa and Jonathon's stories on the next pages.

2003 also saw the creation of some new marketing tools, not the least of which is our new web site. A very special thanks to Chris Gardner, son of Judy Conn, our volunteer coordinator, who spent many long hours designing the web site. If you haven't already done so, please visit our site at www.emmanorton.org.

In addition, we created a new, 10-minute video/CD to promote our services and share the stories of some of our clients. Now available for individuals and groups that want to learn more about our services is the video/CD, an audio CD featuring Nelda and several Emma Norton Services clients in a WCCO interview with Brad Walton, and written materials. Just call 651-224-1329 to obtain the complete package for your event or group meeting.

We are so grateful to our staff and volunteers for all the sacrifices they made and extra work they did in 2003. We are also grateful to our donors whose generosity and commitment to Emma Norton Services continues to help us meet the changing needs of our community and to bring hope and renewal to the homeless women and families that we serve.

Hope for change... *You gave me hope . . .*

My name is Jenna. I'm telling my story as a way of saying thank you. I want everyone to know that Emma Norton Services was my light in a terrible darkness . . . my hope. When I first came to Emma Norton Residence, I had no job, no home and nowhere else to go. I was severely depressed and chemically addicted and even though my friends and family were trying to help me, I felt totally alone. I felt vulnerable and angry and just wished for something to change.

What I learned in the next few months at Emma Norton Residence was that there were people who cared about me, who believed in me. The staff helped me keep sober and on my medications. They kept me going to my meetings and focused on the goals I'd set for myself. Today, I'm well on my way to being better, but I realize now I couldn't have done it alone. With the help of Emma Norton Services I'm making some big changes in my life.



Restoring self-esteem... *You made me feel like somebody . . .*

Emma Norton Residence

Emma Norton Residence provides safe, secure and affordable housing for women who are struggling with issues that have overwhelmed their lives—domestic abuse, unemployment, mental health issues and chemical use or dependency.

Residents enter either the Dual Disorder or Jane Addams Transitional Housing Program and set goals toward independence and self-sufficiency, working closely with staff to stabilize their lives. They spend at least 20 hours a week in school, at work, volunteering, or in some other self-improvement program and participate in workshops and community building activities. Children are allowed to visit the residence and spend weekend nights with their moms.

My name is Diane. Looking at me today, you wouldn't have recognized me two years ago—or ten years ago, when I first came to Emma Norton Services. I didn't make it then. I guess I wasn't ready. I came to Emma Norton Residence 18 months ago for a second chance—maybe my last chance—after suffering years of chemical addiction and depression. But still I was in denial.

Everyone at Emma Norton Residence was so patient. They encouraged me constantly and were always doing and saying things that made me feel like I was somebody—that I could do and be anything I wanted. Now, I've taken control of my life. I'll graduate from St. Paul College with a medical receptionist certificate in two months. Being here was such a blessing and I'll really miss everyone, but I guess it's time to move along and let someone else take my place. After all, I am somebody and I have something important to do!

Ending homelessness... You gave me and my family a home . . .

My name is Teresa. When I moved into Emma's Place with my five children almost a year ago, it was the first permanent home we'd had in over three years. Both my children and I needed this break. Living from homeless shelter to homeless shelter had worn us down. My kids were especially suffering. All our moving around had meant they had to keep changing schools. I think it was this lack of consistency that was causing them to have learning difficulties in school. It was also probably a cause for the behavior problems they had started to have.

Since we've been living here, though, all of us are doing better. I got a job as a nursing assistant and have made plans to pursue my full nurse's degree. My children are showing more respectful behavior and their participation in after-school activities here at Emma's Place has helped them improve their grade levels. Maybe most importantly, my stability has become a center point for working on reconciliation with my husband. Maybe someday very soon we'll all be together as a family again.

Rebuilding lives... You gave me a chance when no one else would. . .

My name is Jonathon. I've suffered from alcoholism my entire life. It has taken me to the depths of despair and affected my family, my children and my friends. I've been sober now for five years and when I gained custody of my four children a year ago, I was ready to do whatever it took to rebuild our lives. Finding a place that was willing to take a single father, however, turned out to not be so easy.

Then Emma's Place had an opening and offered me a chance. Supportive housing was exactly what my children and I needed! They had not had a lot of stability in their lives, nor had they lived in the safest environments before coming here. I have a full-time job but wanted my kids to be involved in after-school recreational and educational activities. Here at Emma's Place they have all of that even when I'm not around to supervise them.

Paraphrasing something I heard once, "... no one can do it for you, but no one can do it alone." I may have pulled myself up by my own bootstraps, but Emma's Place has helped me hang on! I am so thankful for them! Oh, and I'm also one of their "firsts!" I was the first single father at Emma's Place and in fact, was the first father in any of the programs at Emma Norton Services!

Emma's Place is a town home complex, located in Maplewood, that provides permanent supportive housing targeted to single parents with four or more children. Each residence has three or four bedrooms, two baths, a living room, kitchen and dining room combination, garage, and laundry room. Trained staff provide life skills training, family case management, resources for support groups and counseling, chemical dependency recovery services, and planned social events and activities. Staff also provide after-school and children's programming that includes educational, recreational and motivational elements.

In 2003, 479 people gave 3,313 hours (worth \$56,950) of their time and talent to Emma Norton Services.

By putting a monetary value on every hour of volunteer time (based on the current national per hour rate of \$17.19) we are able to provide matching dollars for some of the foundations and corporations that help fund our programs.

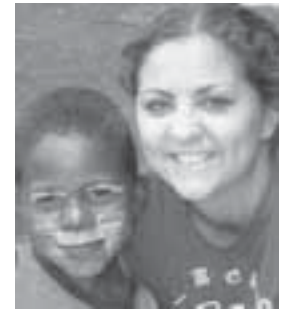

Jane Addams Transitional Housing Program

A long-term, structured support program for women whose goals are to become independent and self-sufficient.

Dual Disorder Program

Support and services for homeless women with chemical dependency and mental health issues.

Scattered Site Family Reunification Program

Resources and support to help homeless mothers find permanent housing and reunite with their children. This program was temporarily suspended in August.

Emma's Place

Permanent, affordable housing for homeless, single parents with four or more children.

Wesley Family Program

Rooms for family members who have relatives in Twin City hospitals. This program was terminated in June.
